## **International Data Privacy**

2016 was a roller-coaster year in the realm of international data privacy. First, the European Court of Justice struck down the prior EU-U.S. Safe Harbour Framework governing cross-border data transfers from the EU to the U.S. After a brief period of uncertainty (and some panic), the U.S. Department of Commerce and EU Commission finalized and agreed upon a new EU-U.S. Privacy Shield Framework that went into effect August 1, 2016. This session will discuss highlights of the new Privacy Shield.
